Advanced Seminar in Child and Adolescent Analysis

September 16, 2019 – May 11, 2020

A series of clinical case presentations and related discussions will focus on issues of assessment and technique in the psychotherapy and psychoanalysis of children and adolescents, focusing on the factors which contribute to change in the course of treatment. Cases will be chosen to compare and contrast work with patients from varying stages of emotional development and differing levels of psychopathology. Particular attention will be paid to specific technical approaches to work with each child or adolescent presented.

The course will meet for 16 sessions beginning on Monday, September 16, 2019 from 8:00 – 9:30 pm. The Seminar will be held on alternate Monday evening as follows: 9/16/19; 9/23; 10/14; 10/28; 11/11; 11/25; 12/9; 12/16/19; 1/13/20; 1/27; 2/24; 3/9; 3/23; 4/13; 4/27; 5/11/20. May 18, 2020 will be the make-up date for missed sessions due to inclement weather.

Course Objectives:

For each clinical presentation, participants will be able to:

1. Describe issues of assessment and technique of psychotherapy or psychoanalysis in the case currently being presented.
2. Describe the mutative factors in each particular treatment.
3. List technical considerations regarding the nature and timing of interventions with children and adolescents from various phases of development.
