Presentation: Dr. Landau will demonstrate how our clinical principles and the way we practice, along with advocacy by professional groups, can influence the law, which in turn can influence how we practice. He will also demonstrate the close inter-relationship between clinical principles and our ethical obligations as clinicians.

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Presenter: Barry Landau, MD, is a child and adult psychiatrist, a Supervising Analyst and a Training Analyst Emeritus at the Washington Baltimore Center for Psychoanalysis. He has written, taught and lectured nationally and internationally on the subject of confidentiality. He has been a leader in efforts to help maintain patient confidentiality while seeking out-patient mental health insurance coverage and in relation to requests for information from the treatment by other third parties.

Who should attend?

The case conference is extended to psychoanalysts, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, licensed counselors, mental health students, clergy, and other mental health providers interested in psychoanalytic theory, practice and perspectives.

Purpose of the Case Conference:

- Inform clinicians working with a range of client populations.
- Promote peer interaction with therapists and clergy from a variety of clinical settings and mental health disciplines in the community.
- Provide a way to reach the Washington mental health community who are seeking opportunities to learn from and with experienced peers.

Objectives of the Case Conference: Participants will be able to:

- Explain the reasons confidentiality is necessary for mental health treatments, especially psychodynamic and psychoanalytic, in ways that are not necessarily true for other kinds of helping medical therapies.
- Discuss interrelationships among ethics, clinical practice and the law as they pertain to confidentiality.
- Discuss using the consultation method as a possible solution to demands for disclosures to third parties who are outside the confidential treatment relationship.

Format of the Case Conference:

- A prepared presentation will include an integration of theory and technique with case illustrations.
- There will be opportunities for questions and answers during the presentation.
