Presenter: Marsha Levy Warren, PhD, is a clinical psychologist and psychoanalyst who writes, teaches, lectures, and consults both nationally and internationally. She is the author of *The Adolescent Journey* (Jason Aronson, 1996; reissued by Rowman and Littlefield, 2004), and numerous articles on clinical and developmental theory, adolescence, and various aspects of culture. She is currently Director of Child/Adolescent Training Program at The Contemporary Freudian Society (CFS), Adjunct Clinical Associate Professor of Psychology in New York University's Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis, and a Training and Supervising Psychoanalyst at CFS, the International Psychoanalytical Association (IPA), and the Confederation of International Psychoanalytic Societies (CIPS). Dr. Levy Warren has a clinical practice with adolescents and adults, and a consulting practice with parents on the Upper West Side of Manhattan.

Presentation: This presentation will emphasize the unending uncertainty that we are all experiencing and its particular impact on teens and young adults, especially those of color. There are heightened concerns about upon whom young people can rely and a general disillusionment with those in authority. Again, this has particular resonance for the young people of color. I also will discuss how social distancing has a differential impact on the development of teens and young adults and address how our current circumstances present opportunities for growth in families.

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Who should attend?

The case conference is extended to psychoanalysts, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, licensed counselors, mental health students, clergy, and other mental health providers interested in psychoanalytic theory, practice and perspectives.

Purpose of the Case Conference:

- Inform clinicians working with a range of client populations.
- Promote peer interaction with therapists and clergy from a variety of clinical settings and mental health disciplines in the community.
- Provide a way to reach those in the Washington mental health community who are seeking opportunities to learn from and with experienced peers.

Objectives of the Case Conference: Participants will be able to:

1. explain two ways in which COVID has had a particular impact on the development of autonomy in adolescents and young adults.
2. explain two ways in which COVID has had a particular impact on young people of color.
3. explain two ways in which physical distancing has an impact on adolescent and young adult sexual development.

Format of the Case Conference:

- A prepared psychotherapeutic or psychoanalytic case will be presented and discussed from a variety of theoretical points of view.
- A question and answer period will follow the case presentation.
