Janna Sandmeyer, PhD, is the Chair of the Contemporary Approaches to Psychodynamic Psychotherapy program at the Institute of Contemporary Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis, where she is also the Co-Chair of the Sexual Diversity Task Force. She serves on the Editorial Board of *Psychoanalytic Inquiry* and as a reviewer for *Psychoanalysis, Self and Context*. She is faculty and supervisor at the Washington School of Psychiatry and maintains a private practice in Washington, DC.

S.J. Langer, LCSW-R, is a psychotherapist and writer in Manhattan. His education includes a Bachelor of Fine Arts from The School of Visual Arts, and a Masters in Social Work from New York University. In addition to having a private practice, he is on the

faculty for the MPS Art Therapy program and Humanities and Sciences at The School of Visual Arts. In the past, Mr. Langer has been an adjunct professor of Graduate Social Work at Adelphi University and New York University. He is on the Executive Committee for ICP's Psychotherapy Center for Gender & Sexuality Division. His most recent academic article *Trans Bodies and the Failure of Mirrors* was the co-winner of the Symonds Prize from *Studies in Gender and Sexuality*. His first book *Theorizing Transgender Identity for Clinical Practice: A New Model for Understanding Gender* from Jessica Kingsley Publishers will be released in January 2019 and is available for preorder.

Dr. Jennifer Unterberg received her psychology degree from UT Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. She is a graduate analyst from the Dallas Psychoanalytic Center who opened a private practice in Washington, DC, in 2014. Dr. Unterberg facilitates a study group on Gender and Sexuality and teaches the Gender and Sexuality class at the Washington Baltimore Psychoanalytic Center (WBCP). She is a Co-Chair of the Annual Stacia I. Super Memorial Ethics Conference sponsored by the WBCP.

Dr. Tyger Latham is a licensed clinical psychologist in private practice in Washington, DC. He often works with individuals and couples struggling with issues surrounding trauma, sexuality, and gender identity. He received his doctorate from The George Washington University, completed his clinical internship at Johns Hopkins University, followed by a post-doctoral fellowship at The George Washington University Counseling Center. Dr. Latham is currently a third year candidate at the Washington Baltimore Psychoanalytic Institute, as well as a graduate of the WBCP's Couples and Family Training Program. In addition to his clinical work, Dr. Latham volunteers with Health Right International, a New York-based human rights organization, and frequently provides psychological evaluations for sexual and gender minorities seeking asylum in the United States due to discrimination and human rights abuses.
