**Presenter:**

Colonel Liquori L. Etheridge, LCSW, is Director of Psychological Regional Health Command-Atlantic. He received his Master of Arts degree in Social Work from the Army/Fayetteville State University. He recently completed his clinical internship and Social Work Child and Family Fellowship at the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center and is currently a student in the PhD Social Work program at Baylor University. A clinical priority for Colonel Etheridge is providing for the emotional needs of soldiers and their families. He was selected as the U.S. Army Social Worker of the Year for 2020.

**Presentation:**

In this presentation, Colonel Etheridge will focus on the impact of stress and trauma, specifically exploring the effects of paternal preconception exposure to stress, trauma and impact on offspring. The presentation will expand on the research of (Yehuda et al., 1998) focused on paternal intergenerational transfer of stress, trauma and impact on offspring child development.

**Who should attend?**

The case conference is extended to members of the Washington Baltimore Center for Psychoanalysis and the Contemporary Freudian Society. We also welcome psychoanalysts, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, licensed counselors, mental health students, and other mental health providers from the Washington Baltimore metropolitan area interested in psychoanalytic theory, practice and perspectives.

**Purpose of the Case Conference:**

The purpose of the conference is to inform clinicians working with a range of client populations; to promote peer interaction with therapists from a variety of clinical settings and mental health disciplines in the community; to provide a way to reach those in the Washington mental health community who are seeking opportunities to learn from and with experienced peers.

**Objectives of the Case Conference: Participants will be able to:**

- Identify theoretical concepts associated with stress theory, unified theory of evolution and epigenetics
- Explain the difficulty in demonstrating through scientific experiments a causal relationship between paternal preconception exposure to stress and trauma and impact on paternal offspring
- Identify key animal studies which support the concept of paternal preconception exposure to stress and trauma and impact on paternal offspring
- Describe actions that can be taken by providers to reduce the impact of adverse child developmental outcomes associated with paternal preconception stress, trauma and maladaptive patterns of behavior

**Format of the Case Conference:**

- A prepared psychotherapeutic or psychoanalytic case will be presented and discussed from a variety of theoretical points of view.
- A question and answer period will follow the case presentation.
