**Presenter:** Andrew Bertell, LCSW-C, is a psychotherapist in private practice in Baltimore, MD. He is a current participant in the 2016-2017 Adult Psychoanalytic Fellowship program with the Baltimore Washington Center for Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis. He has completed a training fellowship with the Institute of Contemporary Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis. Mr. Bertell is also a Program Co-Chair of the Baltimore Society for Psychoanalytic Studies.

**Presentation:** Mr. Bertell will present case material focused on his work with males with severe trauma histories and dissociative tendencies. Considering the question, “*What happens when we don’t want to remember?*”, Mr. Bertell will describe how, in drawing on technique derived from Self Psychology, relational psychoanalysis, and other forms of dynamic psychotherapy, we can assist patients in accessing dissociated and disavowed aspects of self and integrate these banished self states to foster a more cohesive and adaptive experience of self.

**Objectives of the Case Conference: Participants will be able to:**

- describe the importance of identifying and integrating disavowed and neglected self-states.
- identify dyadic patterns that suggest inhibition of early self-states.
- explain trauma as a failure in learning self-agency.

**Who should attend?** Psychiatrists, psychologists, clinical social workers, clergy and persons with an interest in psychodynamic and psychoanalytic thinking and application.

**Purposes of the Case Conference:**

- To enhance interest in advancements in modern clinical theory and technique.
- To better integrate clinical experience through dialogue with colleagues.
- To develop a clinical community and network.
- To apply the insights of psychoanalysis to case material from a variety of clinical settings.
