



The Washington Baltimore Center for Psychoanalysis (WBCP) is now accepting applications for the 2020-2021 Fellowship Program.

The Fellowship Program is a one-year, tuition-free program for advanced trainees and graduates in Psychiatry, Psychology, Clinical Social Work and Professional Counseling. These individuals typically have significant interest in psychoanalysis as a body of knowledge and as a framework with which to understand and carry out therapeutic work. **The Fellowship Program will be conducted over the internet, rather than in person during the 2020-2021 academic year.**

THE PROGRAM INCLUDES:

- Special lectures, seminars and case conferences arranged for Fellows, held monthly on ten Saturday mornings for two hours during the academic year.
- Invitations to the Center's Psychoanalytic Scientific Meetings;
- Fellows are invited to attend Scientific Meetings and conferences sponsored by the WBCP at no charge. However, if a Fellow would like to receive CME/CE, there will be a fee. CME/CE fees vary depending on the program.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

To apply, please submit the following information:

- A short personal essay (two pages maximum) describing the development of your interest in the application of psychoanalytic and/or psychodynamic concepts;
- Two letters of recommendation from professionals who have direct knowledge of your therapeutic work with individuals;
- Your current curriculum vitae.

Applications must be received by July 15. Fellowships will be announced in early September.
