Presenter: Katherine Marshall Woods, PsyD, is a Licensed Clinical Psychologist providing psychotherapy and psychological assessments in Washington, DC. Dr. Marshall Woods has served as a Certified School Psychologist in DC Public Schools, as well as provided psychotherapy services to active military personnel in Doha, Qatar. Aside from private practice, Dr. Marshall Woods is a core faculty member at The George Washington University teaching psychological assessments and trauma, and is the Director of Psychology at the Psychiatric Institute of Washington. She also teaches clinical supervision at the Washington School of Psychiatry. Dr. Marshall Woods has over a decade of experience supervising clinical work and providing services with the Chinese American Psychoanalytic Alliance. She holds an interest in the intersection between psychology and film, blogging for The Huffington Post, the former American Psychological Association’s PsycCRITIQUES, and currently with Thrive Global and Medium regarding this area of interest. She hosts a monthly film series with The George Washington University in collaboration with the Washington Baltimore Center for Psychoanalysis. Dr. Marshall Woods has lent her expertise to a number of media outlets, such as News Channel 8, NPR, The Huffington Post, The Daily Drum and hosts the television show: A Healthy Mind.

Presentation: Dr. Marshall Woods provides psychoanalytic psychotherapy for those who have experienced extensive trauma. Dr. Marshall Woods will demonstrate during her presentation and discussion of the clinical material the ways in which a therapeutic dyad has allowed the patient to make significant progress.

Who should attend?

Established practitioners and clinicians interested in psychodynamic psychotherapy for treating individuals with trauma histories.

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Purpose of the Program:

- Group discussions encourage participants to hear the views and experiences of others in an informal setting allowing an open exchange of treatment and theoretical perspectives.
- Promote peer interaction with therapists from a variety of clinical settings and mental health disciplines in the community.
- Provide a way to reach those in the Washington mental health community who are seeking opportunities to learn from and with experienced peers.

Objectives: Participants will be able to

1. identify the stages of trauma recovery.
2. describe the importance of roles found within the therapeutic relationship when working with individuals exposed to trauma.
3. discuss frequent transference and counter transference experiences when working with patients with trauma histories.

Format of the Program:

Meetings will be three hours long and will be an interactive group discussion with a clinical presentation.
