**Presentation:** As marijuana use becomes more prevalent in this era of legalization, clinicians treating adolescents are faced with ethical questions regarding their patient's use of recreational marijuana and their requests for marijuana as a medical intervention. The presentation will discuss current medical indications for marijuana, what is known about the effects of marijuana on the developing brain, and review the various forces advancing the push for legalization. Cases will be presented that illustrate these challenges.

**Presenter:** Patricia Carrington, MD, is a Child, Adolescent and Adult Psychiatrist in private practice in Chevy Chase. She trained at the University of Maryland and Johns Hopkins University, and has previously worked in community mental health settings as a psychiatric consultant, including at the Jewish Social Service Agency. Dr. Carrington's work focuses on the treatment of mood and anxiety disorders in children and adolescents.

**Presenter:** Sandra Rubin, MD, is a Child, Adolescent and Adult Psychiatrist in private practice in Chevy Chase. She trained at St. Elizabeth's Hospital and Children's Hospital National Medical Center. Dr. Rubin worked as a director of CHNMC Fairfax Satellite Clinic. She completed the Adult Psychotherapy Program at the Washington Psychoanalytic Institute and Adult Psychoanalytic Training at the Baltimore Washington Institute for Psychoanalysis. Dr. Rubin is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at The George Washington University School of Medicine and Health.

#### ***Who should attend?***

The case conference is extended to psychoanalysts, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, licensed counselors, mental health students, clergy, and other mental health providers interested in psychoanalytic theory, practice and perspectives.

#### ***Purpose of the Case Conference:***

- Inform clinicians working with a range of client populations.
- Promote peer interaction with therapists and clergy from a variety of clinical settings and mental health disciplines in the community.
- Provide a way to reach the Washington mental health community who are seeking opportunities to learn from and with experienced peers.

- explain the mechanism of action of marijuana and identify its medical indications and adverse effects on the developing brain.
- discuss the ethical challenges that marijuana legalization brings to clinical work with adolescents.

- A prepared psychotherapeutic or psychoanalytic case will be presented and discussed from a variety of theoretical points of view.
- A question and answer period will follow the case presentation.
