Presentation: This presentation defines the issues related to normal postpartum crisis. Ms. Zinner will describe how to evaluate qualities of maternal behavior that lead to negative attachments with babies. Video excerpts demonstrate the challenges as well as the treatment for both mothers and babies.

Presenter: Elizabeth Zinner, LCSW-C, is a psychotherapist, supervisor and teacher with 35 years of experience. Her special interests are the postpartum period with mothers and babies and the relationship between mothers and young children. She is a former Director of PACE, a non-profit organization which conducts professionally led 8 week parent-infant groups in the D.C. area. Ms. Zinner is a day care consultant, participating in Jubilee Jumpstart. She maintains a private practice of psychotherapy with individuals, couples and families, including mother-infant dyads.

Who should attend?

The case conference is extended to psychoanalysts, psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, licensed counselors, mental health students, clergy and other mental health providers interested in psychoanalytic theory, practice and perspectives.

Purpose of the Case Conference:

- The case conference is designed to inform clinicians working with a range of client populations.
- Promote peer interaction with therapists and clergy from a variety of clinical settings and mental health disciplines in the community.
- Provide a way to reach many in the Washington community who are isolated from opportunities to learn from experienced peers.

Objectives of the Case Conference: Participants will be able to:

- appraise the impact of mother's postpartum perceptions of herself, her baby, and the changes in the family.
- identify disturbances in the maternal-infant bond.
- describe maternal behavior that contributes to the negative attachment in the mother-infant bond.
- formulate treatment techniques for improving mother-infant relationships.

Format of the Case Conference:

- A prepared psychotherapeutic or psychoanalytic case will be presented and discussed from a variety of theoretical points of view.
- A question and answer period will follow the case presentation.
